Dear Friends,

We are very pleased to share with you our 2020 Annual Report. Thanks to your support, the Interfaith Food Pantry Network (IFPN) emerged from one of the most challenging years in our history as a newly strengthened and enhanced network. We are providing access to nutritious food, education and resources for a record number of families through our food pantries and a rapidly expanding number of community partners throughout Morris County.

In 2020, as many Morris County families experienced loss, illness, anxiety and economic turmoil, the IFPN faced a dramatic spike in the need for nutrition and relief. Just as demand was skyrocketing, food drives came to an abrupt halt and our army of volunteers had to be furloughed. Yet as you read through these pages, you will see how your steadfast support enabled us to quickly respond to a community in crisis.

At the onset of the pandemic, public food donations became nonexistent as many food drive resources, houses of worship, schools and businesses, closed their doors. Since food donations typically account for nearly 60% of all the food we distribute, we were forced to purchase a significant amount of food. By the end of March 2020, we had spent much of our annual food budget.

To comply with social distancing guidelines, we transitioned our Client Choice model, which allows people to choose items off our pantry shelves, in favor of curbside pickup. In addition, we suspended our indoor volunteer support. For many months, our pantries operated in triage mode, run by our staff, among a soaring demand.

By April 2020, the number of new families seeking our help increased by 200% over the previous year. Children who relied on school meal programs were learning remotely, putting additional pressure on their household budgets. As families were forced into quarantine, referrals from our partners at Morristown Medical Center, Zufall Clinic, Mental Health Association of Morris/Essex and others increased dramatically.

Despite our own staffing challenges, we never once closed our doors, instead, we responded with a dramatic acceleration of our long-term strategic goals that included capacity enhancements and a rapid expansion of our Mobile Network.

Our Pantry Partners, which are community-based pantries operated by local houses of worship and municipalities, were experiencing the same extraordinary increase in demand. We stayed in constant contact ensuring they were receiving the usual fresh produce, dairy and protein we typically provide them, but also supplementing their dry goods where needed. We held our first network summit, to share information about what we all were seeing and the best way to meet the need in our respective localities. Our Network remained dedicated and committed. As kindred spirits we faced our challenges together.

Our Mission

- To improve the health and well being of Morris County residents in need by providing access to food, nutrition education and related resources;
- To provide hands-on opportunities for neighbors to help neighbors;
- To educate the public about the issues of hunger in our area.

The Mobile Pantry also provided critical support to the many seniors affected by the pandemic. While our Home Delivery Program and Senior Box Program remained intact and highly effective, we needed to create a new program to address isolated seniors living in congregate housing and our Supplemental Senior Bag Program was created. Amid fear and uncertainty, the Mobile Pantry provided hundreds of seniors with nutrition and the comfort of knowing they would have enough to eat.

All told, our Mobile Pantry Network of smaller pantries, senior housing units, and nutrition sites operated by the County of Morris grew from 17 to 29 sites over the course of a year, and the amount of food we distributed grew by 181%.

This resulted in our emergence from 2020 with a new name and a new image. Thanks to an incredible outpouring of support from our long-term friends and many new ones, we are poised to meet the continued needs of our communities as the newly named Interfaith Food Pantry Network.

What you will read as you turn these pages are the astounding facts and figures you helped us achieve. Behind all those numbers are people, young, old and in-between whose lives have been changed as we removed the barriers to good health, success and well-being caused by food insecurity. Thank you for being a part of it!

FROM HUNGER TO HOPE



Carla worked part-time cleaning homes in addition to caring for her four school-age children. Her husband Vic held down a full-time maintenance job and a part-time job in the evenings to help make ends meet and build up their savings. Both are immigrants that have been in the process of becoming citizens since 2019.

Due to the pandemic Carla hadn't worked since March, and Vic lost his part time job. Making matters worse their youngest child, who already had a compromised immune system became ill, and required special care including being fed a blenderized diet through a feeding tube. They quickly depleted the little savings they had and stopped paying their mortgage. Carla learned about the Interfaith Food Pantry Network from a friend in May of 2020.

When Denise, an IFPN counselor, spoke with Carla, she learned the family was at risk of losing their home. Denise recommended that they apply for a forbearance through their mortgage lender, which they did receive. She also helped them apply for SNAP benefits.

During Carla's first visit to the Pantry, Denise made sure she left with plenty of food, including grocery items, paper and cleaning products, meat, dairy and an abundance of fresh produce which could be easily blended. With the savings on food and the mortgage help, they are more financially stable and relieved. Carla was also thrilled to be able to take advantage of IFPN's "We've Got Your Back" school supply program for each of her children. She is optimistic about the future and is grateful for the Pantry's support in alleviating some of the daily pressures they faced. *"Thank you for everything.... the food, the school supplies and all your help"*, she said. *"One day I hope I am able to give back."*

Food Pantry and Resource Center Programs

Our core programs are aimed at improving the health and well-being of Morris County residents in need by providing nutritious food and connecting people to resources that promote self-sufficiency.

Client Choice Pantries

1,002,721

pounds of food distributed

While client choice was temporarily suspended in 2020 to promote social distancing, we increased the amount of food each family received including produce, dairy and grains at the two pantries we operate to ensure each family received an ample supply.

Home Delivery

108,396

pounds of food distributed

107 volunteers made 1,356 visits to 140 homebound seniors across Morris County over the course of 2020. We owe a great deal of thanks to the volunteers who continued deliveries throughout the pandemic, many who delivered to several households when their regular volunteers became unavailable.

Food Rescue

154,410

pounds of food rescued

Our food rescue program works with area supermarkets and food manufacturers to recover food that cannot be sold but is still good for consumption, reducing waste and providing high quality foods to families in need.

Free Farmers Markets

181,485

pounds of food distributed

Additional sessions are available each month to distribute fresh produce, dairy and other perishables in between regular client visits. During the summer of 2020, we temporarily relocated our Free Farmers Markets to GAF Headquarters in Parsippany changing the format to a large-scale, drive through distribution.

Family Self Sufficiency

1,000+

families assisted

Even as services became more difficult to access under COVID restrictions, we were able to help our clients navigate to much needed resources including free school supplies, technology, clothing and eyeglasses, housing and home energy assistance, cash assistance programs and many others resources.

Thanksgiving Program

23,167

pounds of food distributed

Making the holidays a little brighter for families who would otherwise struggle to do so, our Thanksgiving and December holiday programs provided turkeys and all the trimmings to 1,011 families through our pantries and our partner agencies.

Mobile Outreach Programs

Our mobile programs use a network of private and public agencies, senior housing units and outlying feeding programs to expand our services to those who lack access to our primary food distribution sites.

Pantry Partner Programs

42,919

pounds of food distributed

The number of smaller, community-based food pantries served by our Mobile Pantry grew from 7 to 12 locations, including two temporary pantries. We increased the quantity of foods provided to our pantry partners during the pandemic to include dry goods in addition to fresh items we normally provide.

Emergency Off-Site Food Assistance

9,505

pounds of food distributed

As the Morris County Offices of Temporary Assistance enacted COVID protocols the amount of emergency food we typically distribute through their sites in Dover and Morristown declined in volume. Yet together we served 311 families or 663 people via contactless distribution.

Community Agency Programs

63,841

pounds of food distributed

Over the course of 2020 we had many community partners that worked with us to ensure all those in need, whether in homes, shelters or hotels had access to nutritious food. We worked with MHA of Morris/Essex, Family Promise, Zufall Clinic, Passaic Human Services and many others to distribute food and supplies.



SUN Programs (Senior Umbrella Nutrition)



Helping Hands Senior Nutrition

8,448

pounds of food distributed

We partner with the Morris County Division of Aging to provide supplemental bags of senior-friendly, nutritious foods to low-income seniors who receive hot meals delivered by the County Nutrition Centers. 778 deliveries were made in 2020.

Supplemental Senior Bag Program

52,168

pounds of food delivered

Many residents that live in low-income congregate senior housing were left with very little to no access to food while under quarantine. To respond to this need we started a new program aimed at reaching large numbers of seniors with bags of senior-friendly foods, which continues to this day. We reached 1,779 households through this program.

Senior Box Program

45,996

pounds of food delivered

Monthly food boxes acquired from the USDA are supplemented with fresh produce and delivered by our Mobile Pantry. 887 boxes were distributed in 2020.



ADVANCING THE HEALTH AND WELL BEING OF OUR CLIENTS

Healthy Choices Programs

Understanding that hunger and a lack of access to nutritious food can result in diet-related health issues for low-income families, these programs aim to provide education and healthy options.

Nutrition Education

Educates people on the correlation of proper diet, nutrition, and eating healthy on a budget. Provides easy-to-make recipes and conducts cooking demonstrations and food tastings.

Health Screening & Resources

While many of our partners who typically provide on-site health screenings, could not do so under 2020 conditions, we worked with our long-term healthcare partners, Morristown Medical Center and Zufall Clinic to distribute vaccine safety information, register our clients for vaccine clinics and provide access to in-home vaccinations for our home delivery clients.

Community Garden

Our community garden continued to thrive despite the pandemic and a skeleton crew of volunteers, producing over 500 lbs. of fresh produce.

Kitchen 2 Table

Though the pandemic shut down our corporate team-building meal preparation program for most of 2020, we were able to obtain prepared meals for our home delivery clients from local markets and restaurants throughout the year.

Community Engagement Programs

These programs are aimed at informing and engaging the community about the issues affecting hunger in our neighborhoods and offers opportunities to make a difference. Community involvement is a critical component to ending hunger.

Volunteer
17,622
hours donated

Our volunteers are critical to our program, but during the height of the pandemic we had to minimize exposure to both volunteers and staff, and our indoor volunteer program was suspended. As vaccines rolled out many returned and by the end of the year, we had returned to 2019 levels of 248 staff volunteers.

Youth Education

Once again pivoting from on-site visits, we followed the lead of our partners in Education and changed our curriculum to offer virtual tours, Zoom classes, and delivering hands on opportunities with our innovative "Help from Home" challenges each month.

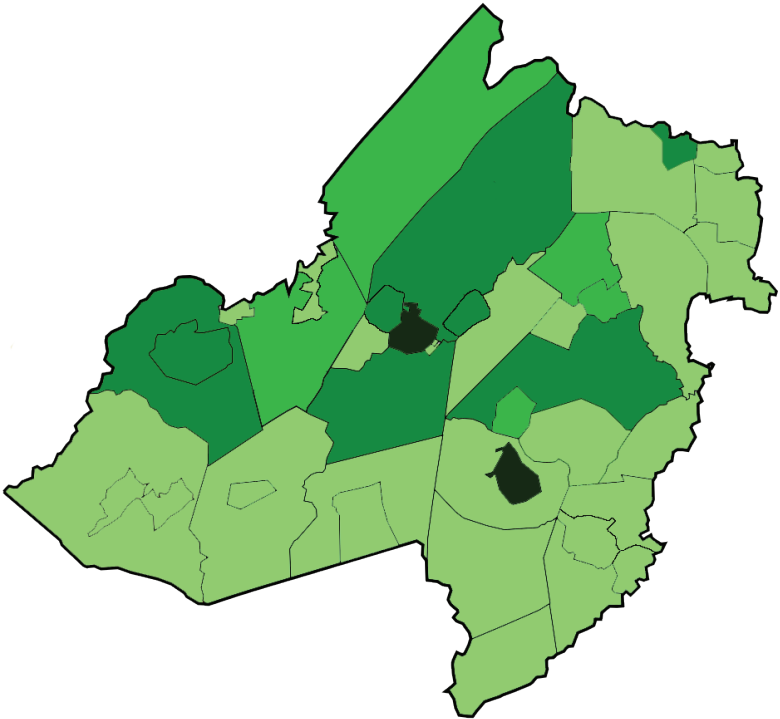
Advocacy

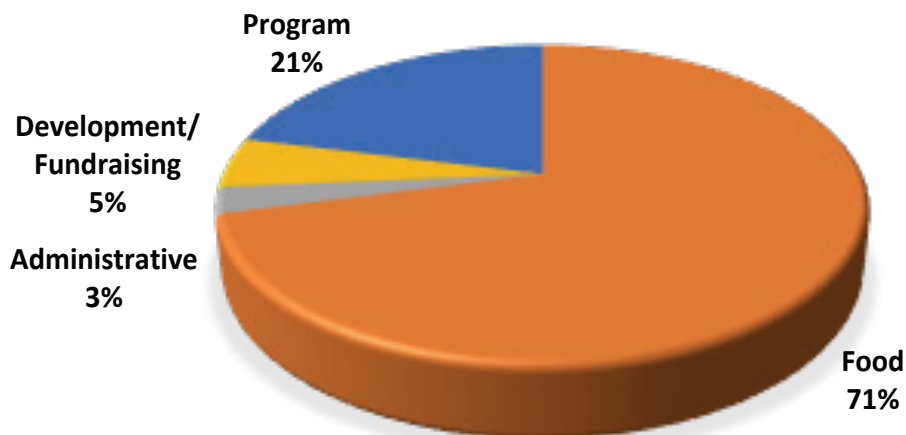
MORRIS COUNTY HOUSEHOLDS SERVED BY TOWN



MOBILE OUTREACH PARTNER SITES

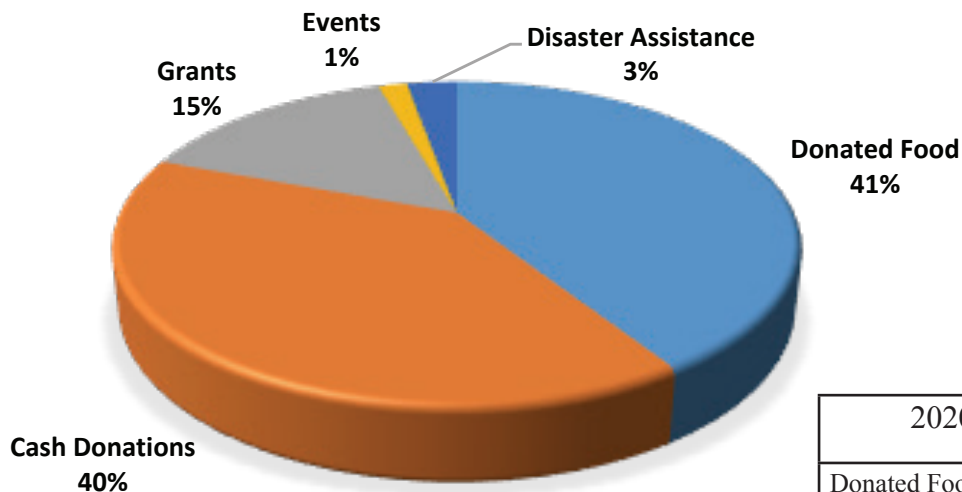

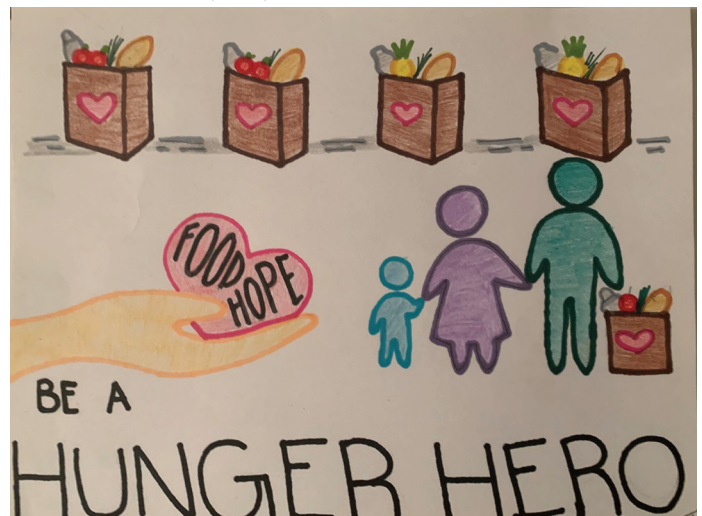
