Notes From The Network From the Executive Director

Dear Friends,

I hope this finds you well and that you and your loved ones enjoyed the holidays! It has been a busy start to the new year and as we reflect back, 2022 was certainly not without its challenges. By year's end we experienced a 23% increase in client visits to our pantries, and saw a 187% increase in the amount of emergency food we distributed through a number of community partners. New client enrollment is rivaling pandemic levels due to inflation, and like everyone, our food costs have gone up significantly. Looming on the horizon is an end to emergency allotments of SNAP benefits, which will result in a reduction of up to \$95/month for recipients. The good news is that thanks to you and the commitment of our hard-working staff and volunteers, we have been able to keep up with this increased demand. We will continue to provide a wide variety of healthy foods to all our families and mobile network partners, thanks to your support!

Some of you may already be aware that we have had some staffing changes since our last newsletter. Sadly, we

We are making great progress on our client choice marketplace renovations. As of this writing the mobile pantry and administrative spaces are nearing completion, and we are preparing to relocate pantry operations to the warehouse to avoid any disruption of food distribution. We are incredibly grateful to **Wegmans**, for donating the shelving, labor, and expertise to help us build out the marketplace and to **Benjamin Moore**, who contributed all the paint for this project. The clients, staff and volunteers could not be more excited for our re-opening this Spring! Stay tuned for more details.

In other facility news our cold storage project is proving to be a very wise investment. In addition to housing a record number of turkeys for Thanksgiving (more on this inside), we were able to rescue more than 250,000 pounds of frozen meats, dairy, produce and prepared foods last year that otherwise would have been discarded. Additionally, we have received donations of thousands of pounds of frozen meats, vegetables, soups and other items that in years past we would have had to turn away due to lack of storage. The space has been a game-changer.

We will certainly have some challenging months ahead. However, your support gives us the confidence that together we will continue to change the lives of all those we serve and make a positive impact in our community.

IFPN Happenings

Surveys Report: IFPN Clients Eating Healthier

The IFPN has been conducting surveys with clients across our various distribution points including home delivery, lowincome senior housing sites, Pantry Partners, and our two Pantry facilities in Morris Plains and Morristown. Overall initial responses have been very favorable with over 90% responding they are eating healthier since receiving food from the IFPN. Clients cited that having more access to nutritious foods especially fresh produce and other items on a regular basis is helping them. Comments included "I could never buy the fresh foods I needed to eat since I couldn't afford it, now even my doctor is happy with my overall health." "I am learning to replace processed foods with fresh homemade meals without added sugar, salts and glutens. Thank you for making me healthy again." "The nutrition information you provide with my groceries is helping me to make better choices and eat healthier." Many report losing weight, having more energy, experiencing less stress and sleeping better, in addition to lowering blood pressure, cholesterol and glucose levels. Eightyfive percent are also reporting that their knowledge of how diet impacts overall health has grown significantly thanks to nutrition education materials and healthy recipes included with their monthly groceries. Eighty percent of clients are reading the information and 67% are making the recipes. Stay tuned for additional findings in upcoming newsletter issues!

Community Exchange BIG Success!

Last September, we partnered with the Morris County Department of Human Services, the Morris County Continuum of Care and Family Promise to host the first-ever Community Resource Exchange Event here at 2 Executive Drive. More than 30 non-profit service providers manned tables to help educate Mayors, Council Members and other representatives from each of the County's municipalities about the services available to their constituents. Sponsored by Lowenstein-Sandler, the event also served as an important exchange for the



service providers to meet and explore collaboration opportunities.
